

Anonym karakter-setting i Dugga for elever

Du kan aktivere "anonym karakter-setting" for prøver i Dugga.

"To disable seeing student names while correcting exams in Dugga, you need to enable "Blind Grading" or "Anonymized Grading".

This feature ensures that the teacher only sees the student's ID or a unique code, rather than their name, when marking exams. This helps to eliminate bias in grading.

Here's how to enable "Blind Grading" in Dugga:

- 1. Navigate to the "Settings" or "Exam Settings" section: This is usually found in the Dugga dashboard or when creating a new exam.*
- 2. Look for an option like "Anonymized Grading," "Blind Grading," or "Student ID only": This setting allows you to choose whether the student's name is visible to the marker.*
- 3. Select the option to enable anonymized grading: Choose the option that hides the student's name during grading.*
- 4. Save the settings: Ensure you save the changes to the exam configuration.*

By enabling "Blind Grading," the teacher will be able to grade the exams based solely on the student's unique identification, promoting fairness and objectivity."
